# **West Ham United Supporters Matchday Experience Survey**

This analysis of the West Ham United Supporters Matchday Experience Survey completed by 7,775 supporters, offers a data-rich portrait of the matchday experience at West Ham United.

It reveals growing dissatisfaction at the London Stadium, identifies the root causes of disengagement, and highlights overwhelming support for **key reforms, recommendations and outcomes** that the Fan Advisory Board (FAB) should take to the club to drive forward to seek positive change:

#### **Key Outcomes**

### 1. Matchday Atmosphere Is Widely Criticised

- Only 5% rate the atmosphere as "Good" or "Very Good".
- Over **70%** rate it as "**Poor**" or "**Very Poor**".
- Compared to the Boleyn Ground:
  - o **94%** say it's worse.
- Compared to other Premier League stadiums:
  - 81% say it's below average or one of the worst.

### 2. Atmosphere Problems Are Structural

Top cited reasons for poor atmosphere:

- Stadium layout/distance for supporters from pitch 84.7%
- Too many non-regular/tourist fans 72%
- Lack of cohesive fan groups in the stadium- 52.6%
- Restrictions on standing/singing 36.8%
- No designated singing section 40.2%
- Lack of identity/tradition at the stadium 61.5%

### 3. Fan Disengagement Is Growing

• 72% have considered stopping attendance due to poor atmosphere or experience.

### **Recommendations for FAB**

# A. Structural & Cultural Changes

#### 1. Create a Clearly Marked Singing/Standing Section

 Large majority support (79%): Helps group vocal fans and improve atmosphere.

# 2. Introduce a "Home End(s)" Cultural Identity

- Leverage supporter groups who can deliver this
- o Implement and promote traditions from the Boleyn Ground.

#### 3. Address Tourist Dominance

- o Reduce casual or tourist allocations in key vocal areas.
- Consider separate neutral/tourist areas (57% support this).

### 4. Create a family area

 Large majority support (77%) a dedicated family area for those wanting a more child-friendly experience

### **B. Improve Matchday Stewarding and Policies**

# 1. Relaxation of Standing/Singing Enforcement

- o Work with stewards to permit safe standing where appropriate.
- o Train stewards to support fan-led atmosphere, not suppress it.

# 2. Fan-Led Initiatives

- o Continue and expand support for banners/tifo displays (over 73% support).
- Use media to promote fan traditions, chants, and history.

# **C.** Infrastructure Adjustments

#### 1. Review the Wall in the Sir Trevor Brooking Stand

- 53% want it removed entirely.
- Only 5.6% support keeping it as-is.

### 2. Seat Relocation Flexibility

o Improve systems for group seating, particularly for vocal areas.

# 3. Explore Acoustics and Sound Design Improvements

Seek expert input on enhancing acoustics via temporary structures or tech.

#### D. Engage Women's Football Supporters

### 1. Stage Women's Games at London Stadium

- o 57% support hosting at least one or multiple matches a year.
- Over 30% say they'd likely attend.

# **Final Notes for FAB Strategy**

- This is a pivotal moment to push for meaningful changes that realign the stadium experience with the Club's roots.
- FAB should/have requested joint working groups with the Club on:
  - 1. Matchday Atmosphere
  - 2. Ticketing
  - 3. Supporter Conduct and Restorative Justice
